



GENERAL JUNIOR TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

REFUND POLICY

- Players must withdraw from the tournament to be eligible for a refund. Admin cost may apply if withdrawal is made after withdrawal deadline and before the draw is made.
- Players on the reserve will be fully refunded.
- Refund will not be issued once the draw has been made.
- All refund will be processed 7 days after the completion of tournament.

ENTRY AND ACCEPTANCE

- Entry fee must be paid at the time of registration.
- No late entry will be accepted.
- All entries are subject to approval of the Tournament Committee.
- The Tournament Committee may cancel the event if there are insufficient entries.

DRAWS AND SCHEDULE

- Draws will be done online and can be viewed at <https://join.me/tennisbcdraws> (time is posted on the website).
- Players are responsible for checking their own match time and match locations.
- No avoidance will be accommodated. Players must be available to play at the scheduled time.
- Players are expected to be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes prior to their scheduled match time.
- Lateness penalties including default after 15 minutes, may be enforced.
- Match time may be postponed or delayed in the event of unforeseeable circumstances.

RULES OF PLAY

- Match Format will be described in the regulations of tournament website. Modified match format may be adopted based on court availability.
- Warm up will be 5 minutes.
- All matches will be governed by Tennis Canada Rules of the Court. Players are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct as set out by Tennis Canada.
- Players without acceptable attire will not be permitted to play. Non-marking shoes must be worn while on court.
- Late Withdrawal and Failure to Complete Required Tournament Events (LW/FC) penalties will be enforced. For details about LW/FC penalties, please refer to Tennis BC website.
- Tournament Referee has the final decisions.

THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PLAYERS, PARENTS AND COACHES

- Players are expected to know and understand the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court and the Code of Conduct.
- The Code of Conduct applies to all players and their Support Team Members (coach, trainer, manager, agent, medical personnel and/or family member, tournament guest or other similar associate) at all places and at all times in the tournament environment.
- Misconducts, whether on or off the court, may result in penalties against the player and/or any of their Support Team Member.
- Tennis BC has a no-tolerance policy towards abusive or inappropriate behavior.
