ELIGIBILITY:

- All entrants must hold a valid Tennis BC Membership. Renewals or new memberships are available online at www.tennisbc.org Select Membership.
 - Out of province players are not eligible to compete in the 2020 selection series tournaments.
- In order to earn Points Race points for 2020 Team BC Indoor Selection, players must be in the given age category as of January 1, 2020 2020 age groups.

• Any individual whose rights to compete have been suspended by Tennis BC or Tennis Canada are ineligible to compete in any sanctioned tournament during the period of such suspension.

ENTRY AND ACCEPTANCE:

- Entry closes at 11:59 pm on Friday, December 6, 2019. No late entry will be accepted.
- Refunds will not be issued once the draw has been made.
- All entries are subject to the approval of Tournament Committee.
- Tournament Committee may limit the draw size depending upon availability of courts.
- All entries that are received by the entry deadline will be considered based on Tennis Canada rankings. Where certain entries cannot be distinguished on the basis of ranking, players shall be accepted by drawing lots.

DRAWS AND SCHEDULE:

- In singles, draw will be single elimination with full feed in consolation. In double, draw is single elimination.
- No scheduling avoidance will be accommodated. Players must be available to play at the time scheduled.
- Players are responsible for checking their own match time during the tournament.
- Draws will be made online at 7 pm on December 9, 2019 and will be posted online immediately after the draws are made. Join us online at https://join.me/tennisbcdraws to witness the draw. Details of login will be posted on the front page of the tournament website on Monday, December 8, 2019.
- Matches may start at 3 pm on Friday and 8 am on Saturday and Sunday.

MATCH FORMAT

• Singles: Matches will be the best of three tie-break sets with full-ad scoring.

Doubles: Matches will be the best of three tie-break sets with full-ad scoring and a match tie-break (10-point) will be played in lieu of a third set.

• Modified match format may be adopted in the event of any unforeseeable circumstances.

RULES OF PLAY:

- All matches will be governed by Tennis Canada Rules of the Court. Players are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct as set out by Tennis Canada. Tennis BC has the final decisions.
- Players are expected to be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes prior to their scheduled match time. Lateness penalties including default after 15 minutes, may be enforced.
- Players without acceptable attire will not be permitted to play. Non-marking shoes must be worn while on court.
- Late Withdrawal and Failure to Complete Required Tournament Events (LW/FC) penalties will be enforced.

Code of Conduct for players, parents & coaches

- Players are expected to know and understand the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court and the Code of Conduct.
- Players or any persons associated with a player (i.e. parents, coaches, friends or family) are expected to give due respect to the host clubs, their members, officials, other players and any other person associated with the tournament.
- Misconduct, whether on or off the court, will result in penalties against the player and any Player Support Team Member (coach, trainer, manager, agent, medical or para-medical personnel and/or family member, tournament guest, or other similar associate) of a player. Tennis BC has a no-tolerance policy towards abusive or inappropriate behaviour.
