Appendix 3 SEEDING GUIDELINES ADULT, OPEN AND SENIOR EVENTS



Purpose

The purpose of seeding is to ensure a fair and balanced draw in which the top players/teams do not meet each other in the early rounds of the tournament.

Guidelines

It is advisable to seed one in four players in a draw and to have an even number of seeded players/ teams. It is permissible to seed fewer than one in four, and better to do so than to include players of indistinguishable relative merit.

Tournament Director/Referee should consider the following while determining the seedings.

Primary Categories:

- Last 52 weeks Tennis Canada Rogers Rankings in the respective category
- ITF rankings for Seniors, Juniors and Professional rankings
- Last 52 weeks Tennis Canada Rogers Rankings in the one level category above (NTRP)

Secondary Categories:

- Head to Head results against each other or against a common third player
- Significant college NCAA results

TD/Referee should not use non-sanctioned tournaments, or league results to determine seedings.
