

Team Tennis Provincial Championships 2024

Team ties, draws, and schedule:

- Round Robin team tournament
- In each tie of the round robin there will be:
 - Women's division total 4 match ties of : #1 Doubles, #2 Doubles, #3 Doubles
 - Men's division total 3 match ties of: #1 Singles #2 Doubles, #3 Doubles
- Roster must be submitted in order of strength, including spares (Court 1 to Court 3).
- Once the roster has been submitted players may then only move 1 position up or down for the duration of the tournament.
- 15 minutes before your match starts, the team captain will go to the tournament desk to submit their lineup for the upcoming match.

The Format for this event will be:

- Round Robin tournament
- Match format:
 - Best of three tie-break sets with one deuce only, sudden death at 2nd deuce and a 10-point match tie break in lieu of 3rd set.
- Modified match format may be adopted contingent on court availability and in the event of any unforeseeable circumstance.
- Warm up is 5 min.
- Minimum of 6 players to compete, maximum 10 players. Additional spares may only be substituted in the case of injury or complete withdrawal from the tournament.
- Each grouping at the provincials will be comprised of teams from the Lower Mainland,
 Vancouver Island, and the Interior.

Regulations:

- All matches are governed by Tennis Canada Rules of the Court. Players are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct as set out by Tennis Canada.
- Players are expected to be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes prior to their scheduled match time.

- Players without acceptable attire will not be permitted to play. There is no colour code on Burnaby tennis courts.
- Tennis BC event committee has the final decisions.
- In case of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances, the avoidance request may not be accommodated.
- This is a weather dependent tournament. Match times may be postponed or delayed and matches may be played on different court surfaces, under lights, indoors or at alternate sites, or events may be cancelled in the event of inclement weather.
- Draws will be posted online. Players are responsible for checking their own match time during the tournament and are expected to play on the scheduled match time.

Team Score:

- 2 points will be given to each match won. Team score is the total points of all matches played.
- The winning team of round robin will be determined by the highest number of points.
- If 2 teams are tied with the same number of points, the tie will be broken by Head to Head result of the 2 teams.
- If 3 teams are tied with the same number of points, the tie will be broken as follows:
 - The percentage between the number of sets won and the number of sets lost.
 - If, after this calculation, there are still teams that remain tied, the percentage between the number of games won and the number of games lost.
 - If, after this calculation, there are still teams that remain tied, then the order will be drawn by lot.

Code of Conduct for players, parents & coaches

- Players are expected to know and understand the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court and the Code of Conduct.
- Players or any persons associated with a player (i.e. parents, coaches, friends or family)
 are expected to give due respect to the host clubs, their members, officials, other players
 and any other person associated with the tournament.
- Misconduct, whether on or off the court, will result in penalties against the player and any Player Support Team Member (coach, trainer, manager, agent, medical or paramedical personnel and/or family member, tournament guest, or other similar associate)

of a player. Tennis BC has a zero-tolerance policy towards abusive or inappropriate behaviour.
