ELIGIBILITY	This event is open to all juniors aged under 16. The tournament will award ranking points.
ENTRY PROCEDURES	Entries are to be made through Tennis BC, at the links provided above indicated Registration & Information
ACCEPTANCE PROCESS	Draw size are limited to <b>64</b> .
FORMAT	<ul> <li>Singles draw, with 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> place play-off matches. There is no consolation for singles play.</li> <li>Matches will be the best of 3 tie-break sets and regular scoring.</li> <li>Doubles matches are played as a best-of-three sets, with each set consisting of four games, and a tiebreaker at 3-3, using "no-ad" scoring where the next point wins at deuce. A 10-point match tie breaker will be played for the third set.</li> </ul>
RULES OF THE COURT	All events are run using the <u>Tennis Canada Rules of the Court</u> .

SEEDING	Seeding for all events will be based on the latest National Bank Rankings as of the Tuesday before the draw date.
OFFICIALS	Tennis Canada certified Referees, Roving and Chair umpires will be at each tournament. The draw will be conducted by the Tournament Referee.
TRAVEL	All travel needs are the responsibility of each player.
